


# Cornwall Travel Information

## Truro




Parking: NCP Truro Highcross (multistorey, open 24 hours, short if slightly grotty walk to cathedral - top left corner of map above) is long stay and pre-bookable (which may be worth considering given that it's half term). NB I didn't have any problem but the parking spaces are on the small side. Fees not excessive by today's standards:

**NB** The Old Bridge car park is very close to the cathedral and almost next door to the restaurant BUT it's short stay only which counts it out for evensong and dinner.

## Falmouth



Arrow indicates All Saints Church which is helpfully on a number of bus routes including the shuttle bus (route in red) which links the 2 long stay car parks. Visitor Yacht Haven is also marked for any of you planning to arrive in style. On-street (free) parking at the upper end of Killigrew Street. There's room for around a dozen cars in the car park at the church but if you're planning to spend the day in Falmouth (which has plenty to occupy you) then I think it'd be manners not to use the church car park until rehearsal time. Car sharing is encouraged! Your guests may be interested to know that free parking is also available at the rugby club on Dracaena Avenue TR11 2FB from 6pm to midnight. It uses ANPR recognition therefore a list of number plates will be collated at the church.


## Blackawton

The village sits at the centre of a positive spider web of tiny (and I mean tiny) Devon lanes. This is one of the main roads into the village to give you an idea:



Ideally you should approach from the A3122 which means taking a somewhat counter-intuitive loop towards Totnes then back west on the A381 but minimises grappling with potholes, blind bends and locals with a death wish (believe me, you'll meet all of these). The turning off the A3122 is at Forces Cross onto a small lane. Follow this all the way to a T junction (ignoring a

few lanes and tracks coming in from left and right on the way down) which is just beyond the comforting sight of the Blackawton village sign. Turn right and go straight through the village, past the George Inn, the village shop and the church. At this point you're on Vicarage Road (and probably wondering where on earth you're going). Right at the far end of the village the road swings sharp right BUT you need to keep straight on (still Vicarage Road) which is marked as a cul de sac. There's a slightly misleading sign for the village hall on this junction (see below). The entrance to the village hall (and car park) is on your right just beyond this junction immediately beyond a road called The Grove (see below).

### Trains and Buses

Cornwall is well served by trains and, to an extent, by buses.

## **Truro**

Direct trains from Bristol Temple Meads (dep 7:38 arr 11:01, dep 8:45 arr 12:32) and Taunton (dep 8:17 arr 11:01, dep 9:45 arr 12:32). All heading to Penzance.

## **Falmouth**

Closest station to the church is Penmere (8 minute walk). Trains from Truro are every half hour (03 and 33 minutes past the hour) and heading to Falmouth Docks. If you're staying in Truro (especially at the Premier Inn) then the U1 bus will take you door to door (stops at the Caravan Park, 4 minute walk from the hotel then at the top of Killigrew Street in Falmouth, literally outside the church).

Dep Truro: 20 minutes past the hour  
Dep Caravan Park: 30 minutes past the hour  
Arr Killigrew Street: 1 minute past the hour

Dep Truro: 50 minutes past the hour  
Dep Caravan Park: on the hour  
Arr Killigrew Street: 31 minutes past the hour

And on the way back:

Dep Killigrew Street: 22:46 (previous one too tight on time for concert end)  
Arr Carnon Downs The Forge: 23:15 (this is the last bus!)

## **Fal Mussel Visitor Card**

For £37 (1 day, 2 day and 6 day cards also available) you can have unlimited travel on buses, local trains and (gloriously) ferries including Falmouth-St Mawes, the King Harry Floating Bridge and Flushing-Falmouth.

## **Blackawton**

If anyone is planning to get to Blackawton by public transport then your best bet is to get to Totnes by train (well served, even on Sundays) and organise a lift from there.
